


Part Mounting



Wire Routing And Connections

- Pay special attention when attaching fitting kit wires to vehicle wires with Splicing connectors. The anvil must make contact with both wires.
- Do not forcibly pull on any wires when routing wire harnesses. Doing so may result in open connections, or damage the wiring insulation, which could cause a short circuit.



 When disconnecting connectors, do not pull on the wires. Instead, press firmly on the tab release, and pull on the connector body.




 When plugging in or reconnecting connectors, be sure to line up the connectors so that pins do not become bent, and pull the connectors tightly until they lock together.



Route wire harnesses away from where they may be pierced by the tip of a self-tapping screw, and so they will not come into contact with sharp metal edges.



To avoid loose wires, secure wire harnesses to nearby wiring with supplied wire ties.







(34) Insert the terminal of control switch into the K (Male, White, 3Pin) connector. (Fig. 55)




After inserting the connector, engage the lock tab on the rear face of the connector; and press the lock tab into position until it clicks.

- Connect the ① (Female, White, 3Pin) connector to the ® (Male, White, 3Pin) connector.






- (36) Checking fully-closed position of throttle link. (Fig. 58)
- With the throttle valve fully closed, ensure that no clearance exists between the throttle stopper.
- If there is a clearance, eliminate the clearance by adjusting nut of the throttle cable.

Section III - Functional Verifications

TEST THE SYSTEM

After completing the system installation, the system must be checked for proper connection and correct operation.

1. INPUT DIAGNOSIS

This function verifies the input signals from the switches of the cruise controller. This is performed by observing the changes in the blinking of the CRUISE indicator light while the conditions of the switches are changed.

PRECAUTIONS

- Before starting an input diagnosis, make sure that the connectors that had been disconnected during the installation are securely
 connected.
- 2. Carry out the checks in a location in which the vehicle can be driven at low speeds (13 km/h minimum) (approx. 8MPH).
- 3. If the MASTER CAUTION is output when the ignition switch is turned ON, refer to the repair manual.
- If the system does not proceed to input diagnosis or if the blinking of the CRUISE indicator light does not change correctly during input diagnosis, refer to the repair manual.
- 5. If diagnostic trouble codes (14) are output while performing the step ③ described below, make sure to carry out the actions indicated in the repair manual.
- 6. Maintain the pedals and the shift lever in the same state as previous until further instructions.

 ③ Approximately 7 seconds later, the power indicator light turns OFF and the actuator check starts. (This is an auto check performed by the system.)
- 4 After the actuator check has been completed, the power indicator light blinks as shown in Fig.4. Then, release the ON-OFF button of the control switch. (At this time, the blinking normally changes to that shown in Fig. 2.)
- From this point, the system enters the input diagnosis mode. If the state of the brake pedal or the shift position has changed before this point, the system does not enter the input diagnosis mode.
- If the system does not enter the input diagnosis mode even if the operation has been carried out correctly, perform a repair according to the repair manual. (Trouble shooting table No.4)
- ⑤ Move the shift lever to position D (on a manual transmission vehicle, place the shift lever in neutral and remove the foot from the clutch pedal) and make sure that the blinking changes to that shown in Fig.1.
- After checking, return the shift lever to position P (on a manual transmission vehicle, keep the shift lever in neutral and press the clutch pedal).
- If the blinking does not change, perform a repair according to the repair manual. (Trouble shooting table No.5)
- ⑥ On the control switch, press the ON-OFF button, the SET/COAST button, and the RES/ACC button, and make sure that the blinking changes as shown in Figure 4, 5, and 6, respectively.
- Do not press more than two switches at once. If more than two switches are pressed, momentarily move your hand away from the control switch, and repeat the operation.
- If the blinking does not change, perform a repair according to the repair manual. (Trouble shooting table No.13)

Section III - Functional Verifications

If the blinking does not change, perform a repair according to the repair manual. (Trouble shooting table No.6)

® Carry out a normal start off operation. When the vehicle speed reaches approximately 13 km/h (approx. 8 MPH), the power indicator light stops blinking, and the diagnosis operation ends.

If the blinking does not change, perform a repair according to the repair manual. (Trouble shooting table No.12)

CANCELING CONDITIONS

Even if the system is undergoing diagnosis, the input diagnosis ends if any one of the operations listed below has been performed.

The ignition switch has been turned OFF.
 The vehicle speed has exceeded 13 km/h (approx. 8 MPH).

2. CHECKING THE SYSTEM OPERATION

Check the operation on the vehicle in which the system is installed.
